MUIC AS INCUBATOR FOR STUDENTS' SUCCESS






THE PLANET 2022 FINALIST

and also encouraged them to systematically work through their problems along with receiving feedback on their social venture business canvas that will help them refine their ideas further in the future.








TRAINING FOR **NEW STUDENT LEADERS**






BLOCKCHAIN CLUB'S BITCOIN SEMINAR


On the other hand, Asst. Prof. Dr. Patsarin Wongkamhang, Associate Dean for Strategic Planning and Quality Development, who heads MUIC's Office of Strategic Planning, said other academic divisions can also participate in this initiative. She gave as examples the Business Administration's faculty members and students taking charge of the business plan. Tourism and Hospitality Management Division's students and their professors take care of food presentation, while Fine and Applied Arts Division's contribution would be the project's brand design.

Already this partnership has borne fruit when a team of three Food Science and Technology students and their faculty adviser and a chef from Tonklar Facai was among the Top 60 teams (from among 2000+ teams that participated) in the "APEC 2022 Future Food for Sustainability: Plate to Planet" competition in October 2022 (see related story).

As this project slowly takes form, it demonstrates the potential of the synergy between the academe and the business sector.



In March 2022, the ASEAN University Network-Quality Assurance (AUN-QA) officially accredited two more academic programs of Mahidol University International College (MUIC), namely, Computer Science and Communication Design programs. Two months earlier, MUIC's Chemistry Program achieved recognition from the American Chemical Society (ACS).

MUIC 2nd RUNNER-UP **IN MU GREEN RANKING 2021**


The MU Green Ranking is an environmental performance score from the MU-Ecodata system and serves as a preliminary information for the university's planning operations especially in supporting sustainable development.
