## CHAPTER II

## Research Method

## Population:

The population consisted of 706 students who registered for graduation in the academic year 20212022. Approximately 323 (45.75\%) of these students completed and returned the survey.

Tool:
The tool of this survey was a questionnaire that was adapted from the survey developed by the Division of Education Administration, Mahidol University (แบบสอบถามความพึงพอใจหลักสูตร) and was translated from Thai into English. The questionnaire was divided into 4 parts as follows:

- Part 1 is Respondent's Profile: Program/ Major, Cumulative GPA, and Gender.

## Data Collection and Analysis:

1. Online questionnaires of Graduates Survey for the Academic Year 2021-2022 were submitted by email to all students who registered for graduation in trimester 3/2020-2021, trimester 1/2021-2022, and trimester 2/2021-2022 at the Office of Educational Affairs.
2. The graduates completed the online questionnaires that were developed by the Academic Strategy Unit, the Office of Educational Affairs within the given deadline.
3. The collected data was coded and analyze by using SPSS program to obtain Descriptive Statistics including frequencies, percentages, means, and standard deviations.
4. Additional comments and suggestions were reported.

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## CHAPTER IV

## Conclusion

The Graduates Survey for Academic Year 2021-2022 was conducted with a response rate of $45.75 \%$ with 323 out of 706 graduates who registered for graduation in the academic year 20212022. They were asked to complete the questionnaires by email for the purpose of curriculum development.

According to the results of the evaluation of MUIC curriculum from the graduates' views, the average score for overall MUIC was 4.15, excluding the aspect of Curriculum objectives, which vary between the majors. When the mean scores of all aspects were compared, the scores were rated and ranked in order from highest to lowest as shown in figure 19.

The findings show that the graduates were mostly satisfied with the aspect of qualifications of the student admissions; while the aspect of curriculum structure should carefully be encouraged by the College, because of the lowest scores received. The graduates reported that they disagree with the number of credits for GE course, especially in Health \& Physical Education and in Natural Science that seemed too many, whereas they thought that the number of credits for Electives Major courses, Required Major courses, and Free Elective courses were too few.

Finally, for the dimension of MUIC Experience Impacting Graduates' Development, the graduates additionally reported that studying at MUIC mostly impacts on 'Working and/or learning independently', and also that 'Coping with change' mostly affected their contribution to personal development.
