## The partnership

The University of Bristol (UoB) and Mahidol University International College (MUIC) are delighted to launch our Global Transfer Programme. This exclusive programme allows talented students from MUIC to transfer their credit and complete their study in Bristol.

#### Why Bristol?

Bristol is routinely ranked within the top 10 universities in the UK in the QS World University Rankings and is world top 50 University (QS World Rankings, 2020).

#### Who should apply?

The programme is suitable for ambitious, motivated and determined students that plan to become global citizens.

#### **Transfer pathways**

Students on the following courses at MUIC are eligible to participate:

This pathway is known as the **UOB-MUIC 4+1 Global Transfer Programme (Film and Theatre)**. After completing the programme, you will receive a bachelor's degree from Mahidol University International College and a master's degree from the University of Bristol.

## Applying (MA Film and Theatre)

#### **Entry requirements**

To transfer to Bristol you must meet our academic and English language requirements:

#### Academic

- You must study one of the selected degree programmes at MUIC
- You must achieve at least a GPA 3.20 on this selected degree programme

#### English language

- You must achieve **Profile B (PG)**: IELTS score of 7.0 overall, a minimum of 6.5 in all skills
- We also accept other qualifications and English language tests, including TOEFL. You can find details of <u>English language requirements</u> on our website.

You do **not** need to meet these requirements when you apply. You need to meet the requirements by the time you apply for your UK visa (you can only apply for your visa from July).

#### **Application dates**

Applications open: Monday, 23 November 2020 Applications close: Wednesday 31 March 2021

#### How to apply

To apply you should:

- 1. Contact the MUIC Partnership Coordinator to register your interest
- 2. Submit your application on our International Partnerships website.

You will receive a response to your application within **4 working days**.

# Applying (MPhil Theatre and Performance)

#### **Entry requirements**

To transfer to Bristol you must meet our academic and English language requirements:

#### Academic

To be considered for admission to a master's degree programme at the University of Bristol, the minimum entry requirement is an undergraduate (bachelor's) degree that is equivalent to a UK upper second-class degree (also known as a 2:1). You can find <u>international equivalent</u> <u>qualifications</u> on the International Office website.

Check our <u>online course listings</u> for details of specific requirements for each course.

#### English language

- You must achieve **Profile C:** IELTS score of 6.5 overall, a minimum of 6.5 in all skills
- We also accept other qualifications and English language tests, including TOEFL. You can find details of <u>English language requirements</u> on our website.

You do **not** need to meet these requirements when you apply. You need to meet the requirements by the time you apply for your UK visa (you can only apply for your visa from July).

#### How to apply

To apply you should:

- 4. Inform the MUIC Partnership Coordinator you have applied and let them know your student number. **Remember**, if you do not inform the Partnership Coordinator, you will not be eligible to receive the UoB-MUIC Partner Scholarship

## Fees and funding

#### **Tuition fee**

The University of Bristol is delighted to offer an exclusive scholarship to all Mahidol University International College students applying to this programme. The **UoB- MUIC Partner Scholarship** will reduce your tuition fee by 10%. **This means your tuition fee will cost:** 

UOB Degree	Cost
MA Film and Television	£19,890
MPhil Theatre and Performance	£17,010

You don't need to apply for the UoB-MUIC Partner Scholarship, it will be automatically applied to your tuition fee amount.

\*Please note that tuition fees are subject to a small inflationary rise each year. You should refer to your offer letter for the accurate amount.

#### **Other scholarships**

We understand that the cost of studying overseas can be a barrier. We want to welcome the brightest minds to our campus, for that reason we welcome you to apply to our other scholarship programmes:

• <u>Think Big Postgraduate Scholarship</u>: This scholarship offers awards of £5,000, £10,000 and £20,000. Round One deadline is 29 March 2021.

You can only receive a maximum of one scholarship. If you are selected for more than one scholarship, you will receive the larger scholarship. To apply and for deadline details please <u>visit our international scholarships webpage</u>.

#### **Cost of living in Bristol**

Your other living expenses will depend on your way of life. As a guide, most students spend in the region of £9,000 to £14,500 a year on living expenses, including accommodation, although you may spend more depending on your housing choices and lifestyle.

#### What you can study

While at Bristol you need to study enough units to obtain **180** credits each year.

Each of our units is normally worth around 20 credits, with longer units like a dissertation worth more. The following units are available to you while at Bristol:

#### Accommodation

As a partnership student, you are **guaranteed** university accommodation for your first year of study. To qualify for this guarantee, you must apply for accommodation by **Wednesday**, **30 June 2021**.

#### Visa

To study in the UK you must apply for a student visa, which is formally known as a **Tier 4 Student Visa**.

You can only apply for your visa from July. We recommend that you submit your visa application at the latest by mid-August.
