

Introduction to LANGUAGE AND CULTURE

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Aside from communicative proficiency, this class also provides related detailed information about Thai society and culture, allowing the learner to understand better said topics. Other topics include the importance of rice farming and ceremonies, growing rice and Buddhism in daily life.
